Minute Concerning Non-Partisan Political Activism

A recent court decision now allows religious bodies to endorse political candidates and take part in political party activities without losing their tax-exempt status.

This ruling does not change Midlothian Friends Meeting's long-standing practice of avoiding political party advocacy within our:

- Meetings for worship,
- Announcements at rise of Meeting and in the Quaker Town Crier, or
- Committee deliberations.

Our tax-exempt status has never been a primary motive for this practice.
